

In 2019/2020 Barton Church of England Primary School has been allocated a total of £10,560 (£1320) Pupil Premium Grant funding (PPG).

### Barriers to Learning

Barriers to educational achievement cover a wide range of academic, emotional, social and behavioural issues including developmental delay, identified additional needs, low self-esteem, children who are experiencing unsettled or problematic home lives, both mental and physical health of a parent, bereavement, parental separation and families who are without support networks.

At Barton Church of England (VA) School we aim to use Pupil Premium Grant funding to increase the proportion of eligible pupils making accelerated progress so that they achieve at least in line with other pupils both in the school and nationally.

We aim to overcome these barriers by supporting our pupils with their emotional well-being and mental health. This will then lead to being able to raise the quality of teaching, to provide pre teaching of skills and topics enabling pupils to have a head start in lessons. When appropriate, to ensure accelerated learning, we offer targeted support through interventions and group work.

This year the funding has been allocated as follows:

All PP children were supported in a variety of ways. They received free school lunches and home learning packs over the time of the school closure. They had access to IT, Reading / library books and access to the school field for those who did not have a garden. There was at least weekly contact (Zoom, telephone calls, email and face to face contact) between school and home with our PP families.
